The role of the public sociologist is to apply research to making community and social change. This is often not an easy road as our publics include community members who both support and oppose projects that address problems, elected leaders that have to consider political outcomes, and even our own discussions in academia about the utility and appropriateness of the role of scientist in community change. This is further complicated by the cultural imperative to implement indigenous knowledge in the research process to critique the idea of “whose reality counts?” Coming from a place as a Seneca woman, academic, public sociologist, community activist, mother, spouse, friend, and even the enemy to some, Dr. Lovell will discuss when and where we should consider “exhaling” in our public work.
