Required Elements of Website

1. Your webpage must have a singular URL for the homepage that is publicly viewable. If anyone has to log in to view your website, it will not be accepted for a grade. (This is especially important for those doing Google Sites. If the URL you submit looks like a string of random characters, you have done it wrong.) Please ensure that your websites works on multiple browsers.
2. Your website should be visually interesting with a cohesive theme throughout. Fonts and texts should be legible. The overall structure and design of your website is 100% up to you. So long as it is visually appealing and legible, you will be fine.
3. You will need to design the following webpages:
 - a. About Me page – (Due in this module)
 - b. Page 1 – UDL in my Classroom (Due in this module)
 - c. Page 2 – UDL in my IDP (Assigned during Module 3)
 - d. Page 3 – Classroom UDL (Assigned during Module 6)
 - e. Page 4 – SEL/Career and UDL (Assigned during Module 8)
 - f. IDP & Reflection (Assigned during Modules 7 & 9)
 - g. Blog post (Assigned during Module 8)
4. Parameters for About Me Page
 - a. At least 120+ words of information about you as the author of the website
 - b. Picture of yourself, as well as any other photos to help explain “Who you are”
 - c. Explain your Authentic Curriculum Topic AND why you chose it!
5. Parameters for Page 1 – UDL in my Classroom
 - a. First, thoroughly read Chapter 1 of our text.
 - b. On this particular webpage, be sure to include the following sections.
 - i. What is UDL? Provide a brief explanation of UDL, including its definition and the importance of designing learning environments that cater to all learners.
 - ii. Summarize the UDL Guidelines (see page 5). Be sure to address both multiple means of engagement, multiple means of representation, and multiple means of action and expression.
 - iii. Discuss how the UDL guidelines can be applied in YOUR classroom setting.

- iv. Discuss the potential of UDL in promotion equity in education. How does UDL help in addressing diverse learning needs and ensuring all students have equal opportunities to succeed?
 - c. Make sure that your webpage is visually appealing. Correctly cite all information in APA 7th edition, including a References section at the bottom of the page. (You should AT LEAST cite our textbook.) Ensure that all words are your own and write at least 100+ words per section.
6. Make sure your website is published and submit the URL through Blackboard.

Google Site Tutorial

HOWEVER, it can be so easily customized with a variety of themes and widgets that you can make it look like and function as a website. This one might be a better choice for slightly more advanced users, but I'll also quickly point out that from 2006-2015, an entire generation of web users created blogs. I feel very confident you can do it!

(Full disclosure – this is a personal preference, but Wordpress is my absolute favorite of all of these!)
