Subject: Chapter 1, assignment of chairs, and more

Greetings again, doctoral students. I apologize for the number of lengthy emails today, but I'm pleased to share that we have now identified dissertation-in-practice chairs for all members of your cohort. I have communicated with each of you individually and will follow up again in the next few days with direct introductions of your chairs and next steps specific for each of you.

For now, I want to share some general information about where you should be with your dissertation-in-practice and the work you'll be doing with your chair's support this summer.

- 1. At this point, you should all have a fairly solid **problem of practice** in mind for your dissertation research. This could change, and certainly the way you are formulating or thinking about your PoP *will* change as you work with your chair.
- 2. Based on the work you've done on your problem of practice so far, you should be able to write a draft of Chapter 1. See pages 21-22 of the Student Handbook (attached) for a detailed outline of what should be included in this chapter. You should send a draft of Chapter 1 to your chair for their review by June 1. Since you will have a few weeks between the end of the Spring and beginning of the Summer term, this is an ideal time to get that short chapter ready for your chair's review.
- 3. Your chair will try to review your Chapter 1 and send you feedback for possible revisions by July 1.
- 4. Make any edits or changes recommended by your chair and resubmit those by August 15.
- 5. Meanwhile, over the summer you'll want to start **drafting the literature review for Chapter 2**. This literature review will focus on the *root causes* of the problem of practice as they've been studied by researchers and practitioners. You'll consult with your chair as needed about the contents and structure of this literature review and have a draft to submit for your chair's review by, also by **August 15**.
- 6. Finally, throughout the summer you'll work with me and your chair to identify the **other members of your dissertation-in-practice committee**, as they'll be engaged in supporting you starting this Fall. *Please look at pages 16-18 of the Student Handbook* for a description of the role and responsibilities of the chair, methodologist, other committee members, and of you as the student, in the dissertation process.

I'll share all of this again with you and your chair when I make virtual introductions in the next few days, but don't hesitate to reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns!
