This is a very strong project that clearly demonstrates a high level of planning and instructional intentionality. The structure is solid throughout, and the use of technology is integrated in a way that feels meaningful rather than forced. The student materials (directions, rubric, worksheet, checklist) are well-organized and age-appropriate, and your attention to both content and technology objectives is evident across all components.

Your UDL explanation is one of the more comprehensive ones I've seen: practical, grounded, and clearly based on actual classroom application. The inclusion of collaborative feedback loops and scaffolded supports also shows strong pedagogical awareness.
