Hello! Thank you so much for being willing to participate in our AI Faculty Perspectives Panel for the WKU AI Conference on Friday, April 4<sup>th</sup> at 11:30am. - How are you communicating with students about your thoughts on Al? How do you think we can prepare students to engage with Al?
